Region Commissioner's Report



Property Strategic Plan:

Following on from the request by State Office for Region to develop a strategic plan for the management of property across the Region, we have completed and submitted a plan to State at the last Chief Commissioners Council (November).

What is evident from our perspective is the size of the task at hand in bringing all properties up to standard in terms of building standards, legislative and risk management requirements. Over the coming months a program will be developed where a systematic approach will be undertaken to achieve stronger discipline concerning hall maintenance and building more substantial relationships with local government authorities in the processes of renewal of leases and licensing agreements.

Also, Region is currently managing a number of vacant properties which we are looking to either re-start Scout Groups, provide an income that will sustain the property in the short to medium term or in the case of freehold parcels establish a use or sell. Of course, the renewal of leases and licences on these vacant parcels will also be under much tighter scrutiny.

We will be advising Groups to plan for ongoing maintenance through the setting aside of a percentage of Group income to accommodate such maintenance in a sustainable way, which in turn, will ensure greater hall compliance to the required standards.


