



South Coast & Tablelands Region Pigskin 2017 – Service Leaders



As defined by the RC-Scouts, for application to the above event.

Venturers

Role of Venturers

Venturers are able to attend Pigskin as “Service Leaders”. The expectation of Venturers is to adequately assist at an activity base during the day, and assist with night activities.

Camping

Venturers will have a designated campsite which will be supervised.

Rovers

Role of Rovers

Rovers are able to attend Pigskin as “Service Leaders”. The expectation of Rovers is to either run, or assist at an activity base during the day, or assist with Sites and Services/Admin/Catering Teams. During the evening, Rovers are also expected to assist with night activities and assist the sites and services team.

Leaders

Supervision of Scouts

All Leaders who attend Pigskin are responsible for the supervision of Scouts. Leaders who accompany Scouts to Pigskin are expected to supervise the Scouts from their group at the campsite. Therefore, Leaders are expected to camp in proximity to the Scouts from their group.

A revised campsite layout will allow segmentation of Leaders and Scouts, while still enabling adequate supervision.

Leaders Meeting

On Saturday night, a leaders meeting will be held for one leader per group/troop. Leaders NOT attending this meeting are expected to supervise all Scouts.

All Service Leaders (Venturers, Rovers, and All Leaders)

Alcohol

There is a strict ‘NO ALCOHOL’ policy at all Scout events. There is no exception to this rule and any breaches will result in immediate expulsion from the event, and refusal of future event involvement.

Smoking

“Smoking, by adults, whether Members, Supporters, Parents, Contractors or Employees, whilst at Scout meetings and activities will be outdoors; out of sight of youth members; far enough away from youth members that they cannot smell the smoke; and at a place that will not allow the effects of smoking to enter any Scout building [or communal area].”

– Scouts Smoking Policy – LSG 36 – Point 1.6

A designated smoking area will be identified at the leader’s briefings.

Behaviour

All service leaders are setting an example for Scouts – Inappropriate language or behaviour will not be tolerated. Both the Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics applies to all Scout events.

Vehicles

Any use of a vehicle within the campsite area or activity will be at the discretion of the activity leader. All persons being transported must be wearing a seat belt. Youth should not be transported without permission of the activity leader, or delegate.
